1st Quarter 2005 Report

BALLOON RELATED LEGISLATION

Maryland

Legislation that would ban the release of 20 or more balloons into the environment was introduced.

- House Bill 1241, sponsored by Delegate Barbara A. Frush (D-Calverton) was introduced and referred to the House Environmental Matters Committee on February, 11, 2005.
- The Balloon Council testified before of the House Environmental Matters Committee at the first hearing on March 16, 2005.
- The Balloon Council sent a letter to Delegate McIntosh, Madam Chairman of the Environmental Matters Committee copying all Members of the Environmental Matters Committee encouraging them to give House Bill 1241 an unfavorable report.

Massachusetts

Legislation that would ban the release of 10 or more balloons into the environment was introduced. The bills were re-filed from last session as the bill did not move in the previous legislative cycle.

- House Bill 1344, sponsored by Representative Paul Kujawski (D-Worcester) was introduced and referred to the Joint Committee on Environment, Natural Resources and Agriculture on January 5, 2005.

New York

Legislation that would ban the release of 25 or more balloons into the environment was introduced. The bills were re-filed from last session as the bills did not move in the previous legislative cycle.

- Assembly Bill 1373, sponsored by Assemblyman Alexander (Pete) Grannis (D-Manhattan) was introduced and referred to the Assembly Committee on Environmental Conservation on January 19, 2005.

- Senate Bill 714, sponsored by Senator Kenneth P. LaValle (D-District 1) was introduced and referred to the Senate Committee on Environmental Conservation on January, 19, 2005.

TBC WEBSITE AND HOTLINE

The Balloon Council website has generated 105 requests for retailer kits, and 58 requests for email updates, while the legislative hotline and email service received 6 inquiries. Inquiries focused on the following issues:
